The HELLERAU myth is based on the vision of the craftsman and entrepreneur Karl Schmidt, who founded the Deutsche Werkstätten Hellerau and also created the first German garden city, the Hellerau housing estate, in 1909.

In 1911 the Festspielhaus Hellerau was built according to a design by the architect Heinrich Tessenow. Tessenow thus translated the visions of the stage designer Adolphe Appia and the music teacher Émile Jaques-Dalcroze into a spatial structure whose clarity and functional structure set the trend for modernity. The teachings of Émile Jaques-Dalcroze were also an alternative to the previous dance and theatre tradition. At the centre of these teachings is the "moving human being", who is educated to become a complete individual through the targeted training of his rhythmic abilities. Among the students of Jaques-Dalcroze was the young Mary Wigman, who made expressive dance internationally known as a dancer, choreographer and dance teacher.

Until 1914 the Festspielhaus Hellerau attracted artists from all over Europe to Hellerau, including Rilke, Kafka, Diaghilev, Van de Velde, Kokoschka, Gropius, Van der Rohe, Werfel, Busoni, Milhaud, Le Corbusier, Nolde and Stefan Zweig.

Today, HELLERAU is one of the most important international centers of contemporary art in Germany and Europe. HELLERAU acts as an interdisciplinary co-production and guest performance house and offers contemporary arts dance, music, theatre, performance, media art and visual arts spaces for production and presentation. Since the 2018/2019 season, Carena Schlewitt has been the artistic director and, together with the HELLERAU team, implements the program with around 250 events per season. HELLERAU is a stage of the state capital Dresden and member of the alliance of international production companies.

Option 2

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Bus 80 direction Bhf. Klotzsche (exit "Zur neuen Brücke") – change to bus 70 direction Gompitz (exit "Brunnenweg") – change to tram line 8 direction Hellerau (exit "Festspielhaus Hellerau")

Use of the Tram Tickets

You can buy tickets for trams and buses at the ticket machines in the vehicles. Tickets for trains as well as for trams and buses can also be bought at the ticket machines at teh station (attention: there are not ticket machines at every stop).

Important!

Please do not forget to stamp the tram tickets (single tickets/ day tickets/ week tickets) in the tram. In case you should be checked, please always carry your ticket with you.

The tickets are to be used as follows:

Single

A single trip with one change of trains within one hour throughout the city limits of Dresden

Day Ticket


Valid after one validation until 4 am the following day for multiple journeys throughout the city limits of Dresden

Weekly Ticket

valid after one validation until the 7th following day for multiole journeys throughout the city limits of Dresden
